FINANCE

The rest of the meeting was given over to considering the club's finances for the year 1 July 2013 - 1 July 2014 and the annual reports of the clubs own trusts the Wellington North Rotary Charitable Trust and the Wellington North Scholarship Trust, and the two other trusts to which the club appoints trustees. These are the Healthy Heroes Trust and the Ian Crabtree Trust. These reports had previously been circulated to all members and the reports of each of the trusts may be found by anyone on the website of the Charities Commission.

CHANGEOVER 2 JULY

First Adrian Ellingham briefly outlined the legal situation governing the trusts. Then Paul Coutts

spoke to the club's report and drew attention to the need to maintain a good attendance at lunch and other functions to avoid losses. He then spoke briefly about the WNRCT noting that there had been no income from the payscopes. David Pickering then expanded on the trust's report and said that a payscope was now installed in the new terminal at the top of the cable car and this has improved its security from vandalism. Consideration will be given to changing the mechanism to increase the fee to use it.

Questions were invited and answered. PDG Tony Fryer complimented the club on continuing to support the Rotary Foundation.

John Young spoke for the Scholarship Trust noting that the capital sum and the income had increased. He said that they were looking at moving to replacing current investments in individual companies with investments in managed funds to reduce risks. There was some discussion about this and about whether capital gains could be used to augment income and suggestions were made to discuss such matters at the next club forum.

Laury Sinclair said the Healthy Heroes Trust did not have much money but for the present it did have sufficient funds to enable both the Rotary Districts it operates in to make a contribution towards the costs incurred by any of its clubs that introduce the programme to a school.

Graeme Waters spoke about the Ian Crabtree Trust. It supports the Mary Potter Hospice and secondary school students who need financial assistance to take a full part in school activities. They do this mainly by working through schools in the Porirua and Wellington areas. Most but not all schools take advantage of this and most have a scheme of their own which is augmented by funds from the trust.
