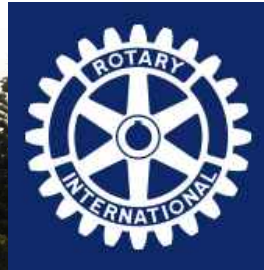

Laurie Bond introduced Emma Anderson and Claire Mabey. Emma is known to us as an honorary member when she was a neighbour as

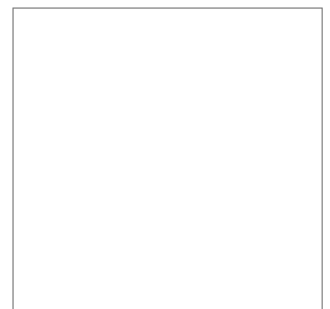
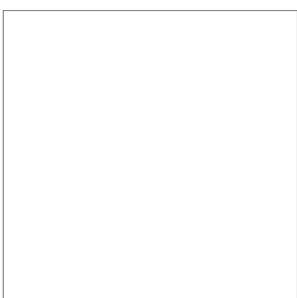
